## Re: Urgent appeal to all respected Brahman Leaders

Respected Brahman Leaders:

It is disheartening to learn that people who have a genuine interest in and talk about Brahman unity are writing these e-mails with wide circulation. These e-mails are not helping the organization, its members, the Brahman cause, Brahman unity or the individuals involved in the debate. It seems that issues of differences of opinions cannot be resolved via this media as we have seen over the past several weeks.

I urge all Brahman leaders involved in these e-mail communications to think seriously about the legacy we would like to leave for our future generations in the coming 10 years or even 100 years. We have to ask ourselves what we are actually trying to accomplish through these organizations. Is this really what we want to present to the rest of our society and our children? Is this the way we want to spend our precious time instead of helping society?
